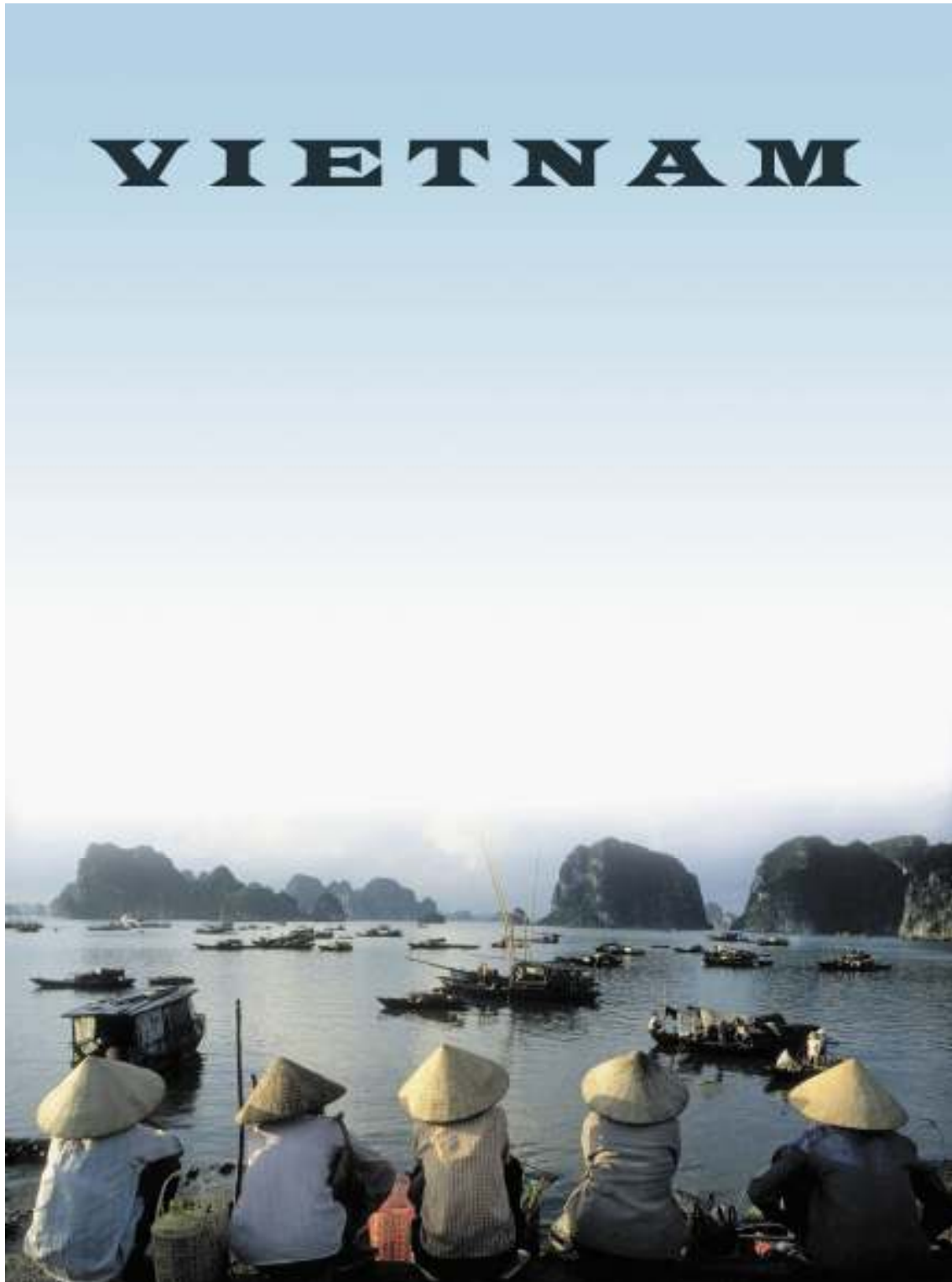

Hanoi to Ho Chi Minh City (Saigon)
15 Days / 14 Nights
Superior accommodation
ITINERARY



Day Three: Hue to Hoi An (pop.76,000) 142 km / 89 mi
Morning ride: 40 km/25 mi
Afternoon ride: 21 km/13 mi over Hai Van Pass
Or 66 km/41 mi to Hoi An

We cycle from town along a flat coastal road, through various fishing and agricultural villages. You will have your first experience of the friendliness of the locals, especially the children. Lunch is at Long Co Beach, an hour's drive. From here we tackle the Hai Van Pass, a very quiet road now that there is a tunnel (not open to cyclists). The view from the top, and on the descent, is outstanding and well worth the effort. (The support vehicle will be there, of course, should you prefer to drive) After a fabulous descent we reach Danang, where we board the support vehicle to drive to Hoi An (you are welcome to cycle if you wish).

You may like to visit China Beach where American servicemen went for their R&R during the Vietnam /American War or a marble factory and view the exquisite workmanship.

Day Four: Hoi An. Rest Day

Today is a day at leisure to explore this delightful town (dating back to 200BC) with its street side cafes, artists and markets. Explore the historic architecture of Japanese and French origin, take in the morning concert of traditional music or take a gentle ride (c.10km return) to fabulous Hoi An beach. There is much to see and do. (There are wonderful pastry shops in the old town and excellent tailors who will make any garment to measure, including cycle tops, in a few hours).

There is a wonderful cooking school in Hoi An, let your guide know if you would like to book a cooking class.

Let your guide know if you would like a longer ride.

Day Five: Hoi An to Quang Ngai (pop.108,000): 118km/ 74 mi
 Morning Ride 41 km / 25 mi
 Afternoon Ride 31 km / 19 mi

We leave Hoi An on a delightful little road into the countryside where we will sample a slice of rural Vietnamese life. Approaching Quang Ngai we take another lovely side road, passing a fishing village and a lively local market. The route includes twelve km of unsealed road; it is quite rideable but the support vehicle will never be far away. The ride finishes at My Lai; you may wish to visit the memorial site.

The Central Hotel is not of the same standard as the rest of the accommodation on this trip. But please remember that it is the best available place to stay, the cycling is lovely between Hoi An and Quang Ngai and Quang Ngai and Qui Nhon, and it would be far too long a day to go all the way from Hoi An to Qui Nhon, even if you drove all the way.

Day Six: Quang Ngai to Qui Nhon(pop 260,000): 178 km/ 111 mi
 Cycling section: 80 km/ 50 mi

We drive to Tam Quan to commence cycling on an attractive minor road. It includes 2 steep (c. 10%) climbs, and excellent coastal views. We drive the final 32km to our seaside resort.

Day Seven: Qui Nhon to Nha Trang (pop.315,000): 241 km
 Dieu to Tri to Chi Thanh: 73 km / 45 mi
 Tuy Hoa to Ca Pass: 40 km / 25 mi

Fifteen km from town – you may wish to drive this – we take a delightful quiet road up a gentle valley and then down to Chi Thanh; it includes 17 km of unpaved. The afternoons ride includes great coastal riding before reaching the hwy again and driving into the city.

There may be time to visit an ancient Cham Tower, a relic from the ethnic people who once ruled this part of Vietnam.

Day Eight: Nha Trang Rest day

Today there is the option of a boat trip to the islands. You will visit a fishing village and be rowed ashore in Vietnamese round boats. There will be time to swim and snorkel, so bring your 'togs'. A stop will be made at the Oceanographic Institute and Tri Nguyen Aquarium; lunch will be at a lovely bamboo restaurant on an offshore island, returning to Nha Trang mid afternoon. You may like to visit an ancient Cham Tower, a relic from the ethnic people who once ruled this part of Vietnam.

Day Nine: Nha Trang to Buon Ma Thout (pop187,000) 184 km / 115 mi
Cycling section: 50 km / 37 mi (or further if you wish)

Today we cycle through the mountainous Central Highlands. A feature is the long houses of the Edeh and M'Nong people (the two main ethnic groups in the Central Highlands).

Day Ten: Buon Ma Thout to Dalat (pop.130,000) 199 km/ 124 mi

Cycling section: to Lien Son: 75 km / 47 mi
An uphill but good cycling day

We cycle on a very attractive road through a wonderful variety of scenery – through hills and broad valleys we head for Lien Son, the summer palace of the late Emperor, with its sweeping views of Ho Lak and the surrounding countryside. We also stop at an ethnic village, with its long houses and may have the opportunity to have a ride on working elephants.

Day Fourteen: Loc An Beach to Saigon:

We cycle by rubber, cashew nut and black pepper plantations. On reaching a road side temple we load up to avoid the busy highway into Ho Chi Minh City. There is the option of not cycling today in order to spend more time in Saigon.

Day Two : Halong Bay

Travel to Halong on the coast, a popular holiday resort for local people and also the departure point for your boat journey to Halong Bay World Heritage Park. En route we will stop at an embroidery factory and pottery.

Halong Bay is one of the most spectacular and romantic of all Vietnam's natural wonders. From the emerald waters 3,000 islands rise steeply to create a dramatic seascape. Said to be the 'dragon descends into the sea'. An overnight boat trip (with the option of sea-kayaking) through this magical land is included

Day Three : Hanoi

In the morning you will enjoy stops at various grottoes and caves. Brunch is served on board before returning to shore and our journey back to Hanoi.

This evening you will meet up with your fellow cyclists for the start of the main cycling tour.

You may wish to arrive in Hanoi early to visit some of Hanoi's historical sights: the beautiful Hoan Kiem lake, Ho Chi Minh's Mausoleum and Ho Chi Minh's house, where he preferred to live simply. One Pillar Pagoda, a small but significant pagoda with a Buddhist representation of the world and the Temple of Literature, originally built in 1070. We are happy to reserve additional hotel accommodation for you.

Day Sixteen: Ho Chi Minh City to Long Xuyen

We will drive from the city to the start of the cycle section on quiet Highway 30. The countryside is pancake flat with brilliant green rice fields threaded with a network of canals and rivers. We will visit the Vuon Co Stork sanctuary late afternoon, in time to see the birds fly in at sunset.

Day Seventeen: Long Xuyen to Chau Doc 58 km / 36 mi

You will pass through huge expanses of paddy fields as you follow the canal system all the way to Chau Doc, close to the Cambodian border. This is a great way to see the river lifestyles of the local people; the canals are alive with boats transporting goods and the banks are lined with houses and fish cages. In the afternoon we will take a boat tour to visit a floating village, where the houses are built above fish cages, in which they grow the infamous Bassa catfish.

This area has a large Khmer community, which combined with local Cham people and Chinese, forms a diverse melting pot of cultures.

Returning to our hotel for breakfast, we can then relax by the river before returning to Ho Chi Minh City after lunch. On the way you will see rice fields with rice drying along the roadsides, coconut palms and pagodas.
